<p>CE ENG-2021 (10 credits) Creative Writing</p> <p>Offered to students starting in the 10th grade, this course focuses on Creative Writing techniques for creative writing by exploring imaginative uses of language through creative genres.</p> <p>CE ENG-1021 (10 credits) English Composition 1</p> <p>Offered to students who meet minimum pre-requisite requirements (Accuplacer, SAT Benchmarks, etc), this course emphasizes the planning, writing, and revising of compositions, including the development of critical and logical thinking skills.</p> <p>CE ENG-1022 (10 credits) English Composition II</p> <p>Offered to students who successfully complete 1021 with a "C" or higher, this course</p>	<p>CE MTH-1240 (10 credits) Math for Liberal Arts</p> <p>Highlights connections between mathematics and the society in which we live and is intended for liberal arts majors. Topics include set theory and logic, mathematical modeling, probability and statistical methods, and consumer mathematics.</p> <p>CE MTH-1260 (10 credits) Intro to Statistics</p> <p>Introduces descriptive and inferential statistics, with an emphasis on critical thinking and statistical literacy. Topics include methods of data collection, presentation and summarization, introduction to probability concepts and distributions, and statistical inference of one and two populations.</p> <p>CE MTH-1340 (10 credits) College Algebra</p>	<p>CE CHS-1000 (10 Credits) Intro to Chicano Studies (MSU-Denver)</p> <p>This course introduces students to the broad range of the interdisciplinary field of Chicana/o Studies.</p> <p>CE CHS-2010 (10 credits) Survey of Chicana/o Lit (MSU-Denver)</p> <p>This course reviews major literary genres associated with Chicana/o and Latina/o creative expression from the 1800s to the present, including poetry, drama, and the novel.</p> <p>CE SOC-101 (10 credits) Intro to Sociology (Western Colorado University)</p> <p>Examines the basic concepts, theories, and principles of sociology as well as human culture, social groups, and the social issues of age, gender, class, and race.</p>	<p>AP Spanish Language and Culture Full-Year Course w/Exam (10 credits)</p> <p>The AP Spanish Language and Culture course emphasizes communication (understanding and being understood by others) by applying interpersonal, interpretive, and presentational skills in real-life situations. This includes vocabulary usage, language control, communication strategies, and cultural awareness.</p> <p>AP Spanish Literature and Culture Full-Year Course w/Exam (10 credits)</p> <p>In AP Spanish Literature and Culture, you'll read poetry, prose, drama, and essays that capture voices from Latin America, the United States, and Spain while exploring their rich cultural heritage.</p>

<p>emphasizes critical/logical thinking and reading, problem definition, research strategies, and writing analytical, evaluative, and/or argumentative compositions.</p> <p>CE LIT-1015 (10 credits) College Literature</p> <p>Offered as the culminating CE ENG course offered on the West Campus, students must have completed the previous courses in the sequence. This course introduces students to fiction, poetry, and drama. Emphasizes active and responsive reading.</p> <p><i>*All CE-ENG/LIT courses are "Guarantee Transfer" courses.</i></p> <p><i>**All CE ENG/LIT courses earn 3 CE credits at the partner institution.</i></p> <p><i>***All courses offered through CCD unless otherwise noted.</i></p>	<p>Focuses on a variety of functions and the exploration of their graphs. Topics include: equations and inequalities, operations on functions, exponential and logarithmic functions, linear and non-linear systems, and an introduction to conic sections.</p> <p>CE MTH-1420 (10 credits) College Trig</p> <p>Explores trigonometric functions, their graphs, inverse functions and identities. Topics include: trigonometric equations, solutions of triangles, trigonometric form of complex numbers, and polar coordinates.</p> <p><i>*All CE-MTH courses are "Guarantee Transfer" courses.</i></p> <p><i>**All CE ENG/LIT courses earn 3 CE credits at the partner institution.</i></p> <p><i>***All courses offered through CCD unless otherwise noted.</i></p>	<p>CE HIS-2110 (10 credits) African American History</p> <p>Explores the experiences and contributions of African Americans from the colonial period to the present. Emphasizes the social and economic lives and roles of African Americans, their roles in politics and war, their achievements, and movements for self-help and civil rights.</p> <p>CE HUM-1015 (10 credits) World Mythology</p> <p>Introduces students to a multidisciplinary approach to world mythology. Common themes are illustrated and connected to religion, philosophy, art, literature, music, and contemporary culture.</p> <p><i>*Humanities offerings adjusted per semester based on student interest. (WHS teacher(s) qualified for 12 HUM/HIS CE courses)</i></p>	<p>AP 3D-Art and Design Full-Year Course w/Exam (10 credits)</p> <p>The AP 2-D Art and Design, AP 3-D Art and Design, and AP Drawing courses are designed to be equivalent to an introductory college course in 2-D art and design, 3-D art and design, and drawing, respectively.</p> <p><i>*Enrolled students who complete all course requirements will sit for AP exams in May. All or a portion of exam costs may be covered by West High School.</i></p> <p><i>**College credit is dependent on receiving secondary institution and exam score.</i></p>
